This month I would suggest you concentrate on timing of the shot. If you can nock the arrow, come up draw, sight and loose in approx 3-4 seconds, you will find your groups will tighten.

A few members have shown interest in field shooting so, as you can see, I have set 8th March as an introduction to shooting. It will cover the basics - sight marks, styles, types of round and much more. If you are interested come along.
