Junior Progress awards scheme

Allington Castle Archers, junior club members, will be able to participate in the Archery GB Progress Awards scheme.

Archery GB Progress Awards are designed to provide beginners and younger archers with awards for developing their archery skills. The junior age groups are aligned with 5 educational key stages; under 18, under 16, under 14, under 12 and under 10 years of age.

Rounds of 36 arrows are shot at qualifying distances, one round per award. The rounds can be shot at imperial (five zone scoring) or metric (ten zone scoring) distances. The awards range from White, Black, Blue, Red, to Gold.

Details of the bow type, qualifying distances and award scores will be published on the notice board within the club's equipment hut.

Once a qualifying round is submitted to the vice captain, they will submit a request to Archery GB for the relevant award badge.

Winter Junior Challenge Trophy

The winter season is almost upon us and I would like to continue to challenge the junior archers. My proposal is to invite the juniors to the frostbite competitions already scheduled in the ACA calendar. The juniors will be shooting alongside their parents in some cases and are invited to join in the event by helping to score a target.

The frostbite is a short metric round, shot over three dozen arrows at a distance of thirty metres. The juniors will shoot the same round, and at the same distance. Younger junior members, those who are unable to shoot to thirty metres, will shoot a similar round of three dozen arrows at a distance of twenty metres.

The frostbite round totals will accumulate a running total for the six scheduled dates (listed below). The junior member with the highest running total achieved at the end of the six dates will receive the winter junior challenge trophy.
